Description and Requirements



Duties

- Manages all funds of the ICC including allocations and expenditures. Maintains a detailed and accurate updated budget to report to the ICC and the Vice President of Finance (monthly). Attends Financial Caucus portion of Executive Senate meetings (monthly).
- Understands and is able to communicate ASI financial policies, processes, and required paperwork. Regularly corresponds with ICC members/reps to explain the funding process and requirements.
- Performs the duties of the Chair if the Chair is unable to do so.

Officer Qualifications

- Undergraduate students must earn 6 semester units of credit per term while holding office. Graduate student officers must earn 3 semester units of credit per term while holding office.
- All candidates, officers, and appointees must:
 - Be in good standing with the University
 - Must not be on judicial or academic probation
 - Have earned a CSUF semester grade point average of 2.5 and a CSUF cumulative grade point average of 2.5 for all classes at CSUF at the end of the semester before taking office and during the tenure of office.
 - Failure to maintain these minimums will result in immediate ineligibility.
